Photography Projects – Photo Editing

[Printing on Fabric, Tile, and Wood](#) (Monday, March 6 at 1:00 p.m. – \$25)

Preserve your memories on different and interesting types of media, such as fabric, ceramic tile, and wood. This class will walk you through the steps, with lecture, demonstration, and hands-on activities. Expand your creative horizons and have fun. If you want to take home a ceramic tile, a fabric sheet and a distressed piece of wood and not buy in bulk, please give \$5 to the instructors for their purchase of your materials.

[Photoshop Elements Introduction](#) (Tuesday, March 7 at 10:00 a.m. – \$25)

This is a hands-on seminar using sample photos. The student will learn basic techniques on how to edit, enhance, combine and create special effects with photos using the very powerful Adobe® Photoshop® Elements program. Handouts will be available for use at home.

Note: Photoshop® Elements Version 14, which is the latest version, is used in the classroom. However, most of the editing techniques are applicable for Versions 10-13 also.

Digital photography has made photographers out of old and young. The problem is in the saving and viewing. The shoe box method of saving these photos is no longer available, so we need to be proactive in making prints, books, or magazines for future viewing. It requires cover art work, which takes some time.

[Macro Flower Workshop](#) (Deal of the Month – Monday, March 27 at 1:00 p.m. – \$10)

The first half of the class will be a learning-lecture on the best settings, f-stops, aperture, shutter speed and lens with many demonstrations and examples. The second half of the lecture will be spent taking photos of flowers in a studio atmosphere with backdrops, reflectors and other tools of the trade. After that we will go outside for close-up flower taking.

Genealogy Program

[Family Tree Maker: Getting Started](#) (Tuesday, March 21 at 10:00 a.m. – \$25)

This class is focused on introducing the student to the Family Tree Maker 2014 software, which is one of the most popular genealogy tracking software programs. The class will provide an understanding of the various screens, views, panels, and how to navigate between them. It will include instruction on how one might start a new family tree file in the software. Students will be encouraged to follow and click-along with the instructor. Data entry will be covered in a subsequent class.

Using MS Word to write Memoir/Autobiography
