We will visit altars constructed outside as well as inside by ordinary people in Austin who are wishing to honor their loved ones. These altars are for Day of the Dead, or Dia de los Muertos, a tradition on Nov. 1 and 2 originating in central

Mexico. The Altars are used to welcome the ancestors' spirits into the home. It is also practice to visit the ancestral burial ground to celebrate with picnics and music. The flowers, the skulls, the food and drink all are symbolic. Come join us for this festive celebration on Friday Oct. 27th .

There will be a lunch stop (not included in the fee) as well as an additional stop in the afternoon at a retail store on West Lynn, El Interior that has beautiful altars and folk art as well.
